resulting in a nearly three-hour station dwell in St. Louis. In October the Chicago departure was moved to 8:30 a.m., reducing the St. Louis layover.

Effective with the October 2005 schedule change, the Ann Rutledge carried separate train numbers for the Chicago—St. Louis and St. Louis—Kansas City portions of the route, even though it was still marketed as a through train. However, effective April 2007, the Chicago—St. Louis portion of the route became a Lincoln Service train connecting with the St. Louis—Kansas City Ann Rutledge. Also, due to trackwork on the St. Louis—Kansas City route in the summer of 2007, the Kansas City Mule departure from St. Louis was moved up to 6:00 a.m. and the eastbound the Ann Rutledge departure from Kansas City was moved back to 12:30 p.m. As a result, both eastbound trains on the route arrived in St. Louis after the last northbound departure, leaving

no connections to points in Illinois. The prior schedules were restored in October.

The Mules and the Ann Rutledge became Missouri Service trains on October 27, 2008, and on January 12, 2009, all four daily trips across Missouri became the Missouri River Runner service.

## Covid-19

In the wake of the dramatic drop in traffic during the Covid-19 pandemic of 2020-21, the morning Missouri River Runner train from St. Louis-Kansas City and the afternoon return train were discontinued on March 30, 2020. Trains 313 and 314, the afternoon departure from St. Louis and the morning departure from Kansas City remained the only round trip operating across Missouri at Amtrak's 50th anniversary. Full Missouri River Runner service was restored on July 19, 2021.
